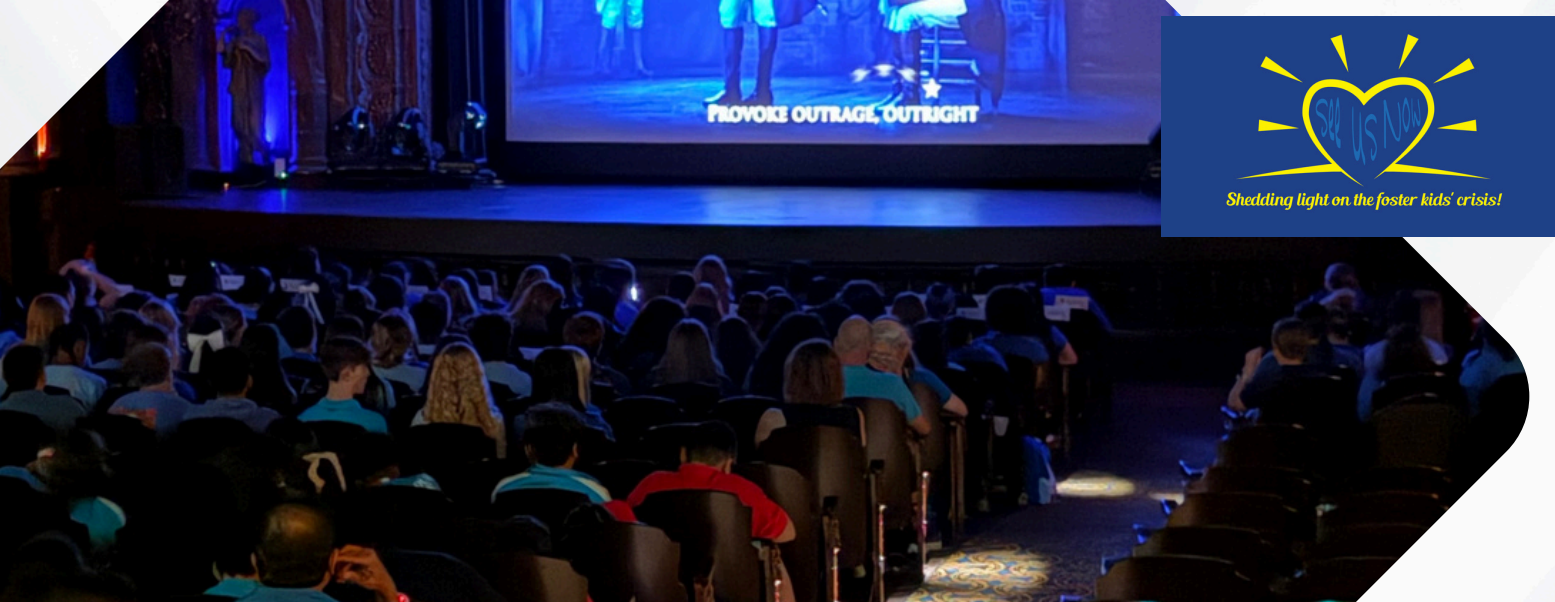

The connection comes from the origin story of Alexander Hamilton. Hamilton was an orphan who has been able to reach his full potential with the support of his community. After his death, his widow founded the first orphanage/foster home in New York City. That home (Graham Windham) is still operational to this day.

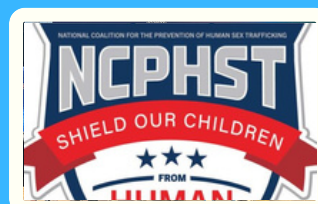
